### Carson Scholar Program – Seeking 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Nominee from Worthington

The Carson Scholar Fund (CSF) is a non-profit organization founded by retired world-renowned pediatric neurosurgeon, Dr. Benjamin S. Carson and his wife, Candy. The CSF aims to recognize and reward students who earn the highest level of academic achievement and also display strong humanitarian qualities. To date, more than 10,000 scholarships have been awarded in all 50 states and Washington D.C. Scholarship winners are designated as "Carson Scholars" and receive a \$1,000 scholarship award to be held in trust until the student is accepted into a four-year college or university. **Each school may nominate only one student for consideration.** 

In order to apply, students need to have a 3.75 GPA or higher for the current school year and be involved in community service activities. To be considered, you must meet the above requirements and also write a brief essay (450 word minimum-500 word maximum) on one of the following prompts:

- 1. What memorable act of kindness stands out to you, and how did it change you?
- 2. Imagine one day at school you are allowed to create a new rule for students to follow. Explain the rule you created and why you chose to make that rule. How would this new rule help improve your school and community?

To apply, please type your essay, along with a list of community service activities, and submit them to Mrs. Southern, School Counselor or Ms. Salinas, School Psychologist, no later than **Friday, December I at 3:00 p.m.** Submissions must:

- Include applicant's first name, last name, homeroom and accurate word count
- Be typed, double spaced, and use Times New Roman 12pt font
- Include the following statement, handwritten, with student signature:
- I (student name) acknowledge this written essay is my own work and I did not receive assistance while completing it. (signed and dated student name)

## **UPDATE FROM THE HEALTH ROOM**

#### November is Diabetes Awareness Month

Type I diabetes is an autoimmune disease that occurs when a person's pancreas stops producing insulin. It is most commonly diagnosed in childhood, but can occur at any age.

Please take the time to learn the signs and symptoms of type I diabetes (insert pdf). It could be as much as noticing a child who started using the bathroom frequently or having accidents when they didn't use to , constantly filling their water bottle, being fatigued, sudden weight loss and can also be mistaken for a growth spurt or the flu. The signs can be subtle but progressive and identifying them really could save a life with early intervention!
