NOTES FROM THE ADMINISTRATION

Dear Worthington Community,

First of all, congratulations to Nathaniel W (Ist grade) for bringing the school another Chess trophy for our wonderful collection. Our students are masters at so many different types of events.

Fifth grade parents: We sent out to each family (2) tickets to attend SCH or Simulated Congressional Hearing. Each family will also receive (2) tickets to attend the Closing Assembly for fifth grade. If any family knows they will only use I ticket or not attend at all, we ask that extra tickets be returned to Mr. Bruce for any special accommodations requested. Please note that Mr. Bruce will only be able to address accommodations for which space is provided by returned ticket(s).

Space is an issue at many elementary schools. Please realize there will be multiple opportunities during your child's school years to attend special events.

Alas, we are now confronted with allergy season. Please understand that students will be outside for recess when the weather is nice. Children with certain health conditions may need special accommodation. Parents of those children should provide medical documentation and may be consulted if other arrangements are necessary. Please note that supervision may be an issue. We ask that if students are on allergy medication that parents tune into the weather and administer as needed. We also ask that those students wash their hands and face before and after recess. Recess is generally 30 minutes long and then students are back inside. Please contact us if there is a severe need in this area.

In May, the staff will begin the articulation process and placing children in classes for next year. The process is on-going and will continue throughout the summer. Staff primarily group students based on reading and mathematics needs. We also look at the make-up of the class. Of course, another guiding factor will be the special needs of our students. We welcome communication from parents who want to make sure we have certain information about your child. This information should be shared with the principal by a written letter or an email sent to the principal. If sending a hand-written letter, please include your email address for confirmation of receipt. While we will make every effort to address your concerns, there are no guarantees of specific requests. Often, we are limited by the number of staff assigned to each grade level. Our plans at the moment are to make class assignments available to parents on Weds. August 21st by 4:00 pm. **The deadline to send this communication to the principal is Weds. May 15, 2024.** We hope to see many of you at tonight's Orioles game as Worthington Elementary has their Night at the Yard.
