Conflict	Bullying
<u>Mutual Disagreement:</u> Conflict typically involves a disagreement or difference of opinion between two or more individuals. <u>Equal Power:</u> Those involved in the conflict usually have relatively equal power or standing. <u>Occurs Occasionally:</u> Conflicts arise occasionally and may be resolved through communication, negotiation, or compromise. <u>No Intention to Harm:</u> While emotions may be involved, there is no deliberate	<u>Power Imbalance:</u> Bullying involves an imbalance of power, where one individual seeks to assert dominance or control over another. <u>Repeated Behavior:</u> Bullying often consists of repeated actions or behaviors aimed at causing harm, either physically or psychologically. <u>Intentional Harm</u> : The bully intentionally seeks to harm, intimidate, or humiliate the victim, often deriving satisfaction from the victim's distress. <u>One-sided Aggression:</u> Unlike conflict,
intent to harm or exert control over the other party.	bullying typically involves one-sided aggression, where the victim feels targeted and unable to defend themselves adequately.

Fifth grade parents: We will send each family (2) tickets to attend our Simulated Congressional Hearing (SCH.) Each family will also receive (2) tickets to attend the Closing Assembly for fifth grade at a later date. <u>If any family knows they will only use</u> <u>I ticket or not attend at all, we ask that extra tickets be returned to Mr. Bruce for any</u> <u>special accommodations requested.</u> Please note that Mr. Bruce will only be able to address accommodations for which space is provided by returned ticket(s). **Space is an issue at many elementary schools. Please realize there will be multiple opportunities during your child's school years to attend special events.*

In May, the staff will begin the articulation process and placing children in classes for next year. The process is on-going and will continue throughout the summer. Staff primarily group students based on reading and mathematics needs. We also look at the make-up of the class. Of course, another guiding factor will be the special needs of our students. We welcome communication from parents who want to make sure we have certain information about your child. This information should be shared with the principal by a written letter or an email sent to the principal. If sending a hand-written letter, please include your email address for confirmation of receipt. While we will make every effort to address your concerns, there are no guarantees of specific requests. Often, we are limited by the number of staff assigned to each grade level. Our plans at the moment are to make class assignments available to parents on Weds. August 21st by 4:00 pm. The **deadline to send this communication to the principal is Weds. May 15, 2024.**
