NOTES FROM THE ADMINISTRATION

Dear Worthington Community,

Weather forecasts have forced the postponement of Field Day. It is now rescheduled for Friday June 7th. We regret having to put off the excitement until June. We are hoping for a clear day and dry fields.

Even in a school as wonderful as Worthington there are some children who wrestle with mental health needs. This is probably true in every school in the county. Please know that the school and school system do have processes in place to evaluate threats from students towards others and to themselves. This process is meant to keep students safe while addressing the needs of those who need help. The process involves evaluating a threat as to whether it is a low, medium, or high-level threat based on several criteria. Once assessed then a plan is put in place to ensure student safety and address the needs of students. Parents of students directly involved in the process will be contacted. The process walks the fine line of informing parents and maintaining confidentiality for all students. Please know that if administrative disciplinary action is warranted, then action is taken. Our goal is to first keep students safe and to assist any student needing intervention.

Fifth grade parents: We will send each family (2) tickets to attend our Simulated Congressional Hearing (SCH.) Each family will also receive (2) tickets to attend the Closing Assembly for fifth grade at a later date. If any family knows they will only use I ticket or not attend at all, we ask that extra tickets be returned to Mr. Bruce for any special accommodations requested. Please note that Mr. Bruce will only be able to address accommodations for which space is provided by returned ticket(s).

*Space is an issue at many elementary schools. Please realize there will be multiple opportunities during your child's school years to attend special events.

Last notice:

In May, the staff will begin the articulation process and placing children in classes for next year. The process is on-going and will continue throughout the summer. Staff primarily group students based on reading and mathematics needs. We also look at the make-up of the class. Of course, another guiding factor will be the special needs of our students. We welcome communication from parents who want to make sure we

have certain information about your child. This information should be shared with the principal by a written letter or an email sent to the principal. If sending a hand-written letter, please include your email address for confirmation of receipt. While we will make every effort to address your concerns, there are no guarantees of specific requests. Often, we are limited by the number of staff assigned to each grade level. Our plans at the moment are to make class assignments available to parents on Weds. August 21st by 4:00 pm. The deadline to send this communication to the principal is Weds. May 15, 2024.


